


**Across**

1. An instrument used by the hitter.
3. The number of called balls and strikes on a hitter.
6. A hit that enables the batter to safely reach third base.
7. Hill that the pitcher stands on while pitching.
11. Area 90' square, with the corners being the four bases.
12. A home run that is hit with a runner on every base.
14. The pitcher who begins the game and plays until the game is won, or he is replaced.
16. The area designated for pitchers to warm-up.




**Down**

1. The fence or wall behind home plate.
2. Player positioned behind home plate and responsible for receiving the pitch from the pitcher.
4. Area between the back edge of the infield and home run fence.
5. A period of play. There are nine of these in a regulation game.
8. The facilities reserved for players, substitutes and other team members in uniform when they are not on the field.
9. The infield playing surface.
10. A pitch outside the strike zone.
13. The team's best starting pitcher.
15. Score obtained when a base runner safely crosses home plate.
